## 1. INCOME

Income at or below these guidelines

Students 18-49 who attend higher education at least half time may be eligible for SNAP—Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program—by meeting income guidelines and additional criteria.

## 2. Do you meet this student criteria?

Students need to let Oregon Department of Human Services (DHS) know what your intended job will be after completing your education.

During your interview with a DHS worker, you will need to share the reason you are going to school that is related to a job you want after you complete your undergraduate education (four-year program or less). This means, if you meet this criteria, there are no work requirements.



## If you don't meet the above criteria, do you meet ONE of these?

- Have you been awarded work study?
- Are you working as a paid employee 20 hours a week?
- Are you unable to work due to physical or physiological difficulties?

- Caring for a child under the age of 6 or a single parent with a child under the age of 12.
